District Charter Days

Step 1 - If you haven't already, be sure to pick-up your unit's Recharter Packet at the November Council-Wide Roundtable or at the Council Service Center

Step 2 - Schedule an appointment (if necessary) with your district executive, as well as with your committee chair, your Charter Organization Representative, and the head of your Chartering Organization (this is not your COR) to review your paperwork and get the necessary signatures. This appointment must be before you submit your recharter paperwork.

All Units Must Use Internet Advancement to File Reports!

Effective December 1, 2010, all advancements in Chester County Council will be reported using Internet Advancement Reporting. This system allows units to report advancements electronically, directly into the BSA system. The process is very similar to the Internet Re-chartering system implemented several years ago.

New Process

Access Internet Advancement through the Council website, enter your advancements, print the report, and bring it to the Council Service Center to purchase the badges. Advancements for a new Scout who is not yet on your BSA roster may be "written-in" and purchased as long as the report is accompanied by a Youth Application. Advancement information from TroopMaster and PackMaster can be exported and put into Internet Advancement Reporting without retyping. The three-part Advancement Report form will no longer

be used or accepted.

Youth Protection Training Update

Registered leaders may have received notifications of not-current or soon-to-lapse Youth Protection training from the national office. This reminder was sent to everyone whose YPT is due in 30 or 60 days and serves as a reminder to renew their training before the time has elapsed. This was also sent to any leader whose ScoutNET record shows they have not taken YPT.

Registered leaders who are not current with YPT will not be reregistered in the program.

Venturing direct contact leaders will be allowed to re-register if they have completed either the general Youth Protection training (Y01) or the Venturing version of Youth Protection training (Y02). This is a grace period that is expected to last only this re-chartering year. [Click here for a myscouting tutorial.](#)



Merit Badge Counselor Re-Registration

Personalized reregistration notices were sent by email or mail to all registered merit badge counselors on October 26th. If you are a merit badge counselor and did not receive your notice, please contact Jessica Campbell at the council office, 610-696-2900 ext. 28 or jecampbe@bsaemail.com. Either your contact information is incorrect in our records or you are not registered as a merit badge counselor.

If you did get the notice, please reply promptly whether you want to continue as a merit badge counselor or not so we do not have to keep trying to get in touch with you. Be sure to read the entire notice as some need to renew Youth Protection Training and for some we need additional information. Annual registration renewal is required for all merit badge counselors.

Crime Prevention Patch

The National Sheriffs' Association is offering Crime Prevention Patches to all Sheriff's Offices across the nation. These patches are given to area Boy Scout troops and Explorer Scout programs for their involvement in the crime prevention process.

In recognition of the Boy Scout Crime Prevention Merit Badge and the Crime Prevention Award, the National Sheriffs' Association Crime Prevention Patch can be given to young adults for their participation in law enforcement related issues. The Boy Scouts of America provide a way that law enforcement officers can take part in the Crime Prevention Program and allow youth to learn more about Sheriff's Office functions in the community.

The National Sheriffs' Association Patch may be worn by Boy Scouts to indicate that they have worked with the Sheriff's office toward the goal of obtaining the Crime Prevention Merit Badge or the Crime Prevention Award.

Requirements to obtain a National Sheriffs' Association Crime Prevention Patch:

1. Discuss with your counselor

- a. The role of the Sheriff's office or police department in crime prevention.
 - b. The role of citizens, including youth, in crime prevention.
 - c. The nature of criminal gangs and their impact.
 - d. When and how to report criminal activity.
 - e. The role and value of laws in society.
 - f. Visit a jail or detention facility. Discuss your experience with your counselor.
2. Complete the requirements for Boy Scouts of America Crime Prevention Award, and then visit the Sheriff's Office to earn your National Sheriffs' Association Crime Prevention Patch.
